

December 3, 2023 (First Sunday of Advent)

Scripture: Matthew 9:18-26 (RCL: Proper 5, Year A) Responsive Reading: Isaiah 40:28-31 Advent Theme: Hope Title: "I know he can save me." *What I was thinking:* This passage is parallel to the one dramatized in today's Advent reading: a woman who is at the end of her strength reaches out to Jesus and finds healing.

December 10, 2023 (Second Sunday of Advent)

Scripture: Luke 8:22-39 (RCL: Proper 7, Year C) Responsive Reading: Psalm 131 Advent Theme: Peace Title: "Silent Night" *What I was thinking:* We may not believe in demon possession nowadays, but we surely need the peace Jesus offers to us.

December 17, 2023 (Third Sunday of Advent)

Scripture: Mark 2:1-12 (RCL: Epiphany 7, Year B) Responsive Reading: Isaiah 12:2-6 Advent Theme: Joy Title: "You'll never walk again." *What I was thinking:* This passage, again, is parallel to the one on which our Advent reading is based. How do we respond to the healing Jesus makes available to us? How can we help others to find that healing?

December 24, 2023 (Fourth Sunday of Advent/Christmas Eve Morning)

Scripture: Luke 7:36-50 (RCL: Proper 6, Year C) Responsive Reading: Isaiah 49:13-16a Advent Theme: Love Title: "I don't know how to thank you." *What I was thinking:* We have all sinned, done thin

What I was thinking: We have all sinned, done things we know were mistakes and that we're not proud of. Imagine having the burden of guilt and shame lifted from your shoulders once and for all. How would you respond?

December 31, 2023 (1st Sunday of Christmas)

Scripture: Mark 1:1-15 (RCL: 1-8, Advent 2; 4-11, Epiphany 1; 9-15, Lent 1, all Year B) Psalm: 25:4-10

Theme: Jesus appears on the scene

Title: "The beginning of the Good News"

What I was thinking: Our Gospel focus for this Narrative Lectionary year is Mark. It has no birth narratives or anything else, but starts with John the Baptist and Jesus already adults.

<u>Endowment Trustees</u> for 3 years: Jennifer Schmehl and Chuck Lewis
<u>Pastoral Support Committee</u> for 3 years: Jim Adams and Lylah Linard. 1 year: Norma Morgan

PROPOSED CONDENSED BUDGET:

Administrative Salary: \$84,765.00. Administrative Expenses: \$18,190. Education: \$0. Building Maintenance: \$26,093.32. Worship: \$1,500. Membership: \$775. Evangelism: \$80. Outreach: \$2,750. Total \$134,153.32

Shawn Quick then asked if there were any questions. There were no comments or questions voiced. Ballots were distributed. After voting was completed, the ballots were collected. Shawn then thanked all who helped with the budget and the Nominating Committee. He then also thanked all who have agreed to serve.

The final count was:

Elders/Deacons, Board Officers, Endowment Trustees, & Pastoral Support Committee: 24 Yes and 0 no Budget: 23 Yes and 1 No.

Thus, the 2024 list of Elders, Deacons, Officers, etc. and budget were all approved.

Adjournment: With the purpose of this Congregational meeting concluded, the meeting adjourned at 10:45 AM.

First Christian Church Board Meeting Minutes November 19, 2023

Board members present: Deacons- Carol Lewis, Judy Colburn, Everett McBrayer, Gary Coffman, Judy Daniel, Jennifer Schmehl, and Peggy Thomas. Elders-, Phyllis McBrayer, Shawn Quick, Justin Quick, John Daniel, Carol Roberts, and Diana Rich. Board Member (Vice-Chair) Chuck Lewis. Others present: Rev. Sharla Hulsey, Carol Ann Winburn, & Don Malan.

Shawn Quick, Chair, called the meeting to order at 10:50 AM. He then opened with prayer.

After review and additions, the agenda was adopted on motion of Justin Quick and second by Jennifer Schmehl.

The minutes of the 10-15-2023 regular Board Meeting were reviewed. The minutes were approved as presented on motion of Judy Daniel and second by Diana Rich.

Financial Reports: The October 2023 Profit & Loss and Balance Sheet financial reports, as of 10-31-2023, were reviewed by Carol Lewis, Treasurer. She noted the October income of \$10,380.78 and expense of \$9,159.80. Year-to-date income of \$96,170.50 and Y-T-D expenses of \$107,107.18. The October report was approved on motion of Phyllis McBrayer and second by Justin Quick. The full reports are available and may be reviewed in the Church office.

Ministers' Report: Rev. Hulsey reviewed her November report that was included in the Board packet. She noted activities from October and November including meetings attended, several telephone calls, texts, hospital visits, in-person conversations, and noted on Friday attending visitation and graveside service for an FCC member. She noted that Morning Prayer continues via Facebook Live at 7:00. She reminded everyone of the community Thanksgiving Service at FCC today at 5:00.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Painting of North wall: Chuck Lewis reported he has gotten 2 bids for painting #1) the North wall of the sanctuary, #2) the entire sanctuary, and #3) External area on the Educational Wing. Bids were: B.C. #1) \$1500 #2) \$14,000 and #3) \$10,000. He stated he has Workers Comp insurance D.J. #1) \$1480 #2) unable to do this as he feels job too big and #3) currently unable to bid on this. He noted he does not have Workers Comp at this time. After discussion by the Board, Chuck Lewis made a motion to hire B.C. to paint the North wall of the sanctuary after Christmas decorations are down in January for \$1500 after verifying this price does include the paint. Motion seconded by Phyllis McBrayer. Motion carried.
- <u>Results of 11-05-2023 Congregational Meeting</u> Carol Roberts reported that the results of the voting on 11-05-2023 was as follows: 2024 Elders/Deacons, Board Officers, Endowment Trustees, and Pastoral Support Committee. <u>Results: 24 yes 0 no</u> 2024 Proposed Budget <u>Results 23 yes 1 no</u>

NEW BUSINESS:

- <u>Stewardship Ketch-up Campaign</u>: Diana Rich reviewed a campaign that is being started in an effort to "ketch-up" and replenish FCC reserve funds. Stewardship Dept will promote this with the congregation.
- <u>Christmas Parade</u>: Rev. Sharla Hulsey presented a suggestion that came from a member of the congregation to have an entry in the Butler Christmas Parade in Dec. 2. There was much discussion. On motion of Justin Quick and second by Judy Daniel it was approved by the Board to participate in the parade. Don Malan volunteered a truck. This will be organized by Rev. Sharla and Chelsea McConkay. More details will be made available later.
- **Department/Committee Chairs:** Shawn Quick requested that 2023 Department and Committee chairs prepare an "End of the Year" report to highlight their accomplishments and give to him by December Board meeting. He then noted it is time for securing Chairs for 2024. He asked for volunteers or suggestions. Several people volunteered today. Shawn will present the full list at the December Board meeting.
- <u>BHS Alumni Home Tour</u>: Rev. Sharla presented a request she has received to allow FCC to be one of the participants in the BHS Alumni Homes Tour on December 10th from 1 to 4. After discussion, this was approved on motion of Diana Rich and second by Everett McBrayer.

DEPARTMENT/COMMITTEE REPORTS:

- **<u>Property</u>** Everett McBrayer reported the pew cushions have now been cleaned.
- <u>Outreach</u>- Phyllis McBrayer noted at FCC will host the Community Café on 11-21-23 with chili and soup. After discussion and suggestions she stated the December FCC Outreach collection will be cash donations for Coats for Kids. She also noted the Moulton Fund has been received and will be distributed between Thanksgiving and Christmas to 14 recipients.
- **Evangelism** Diana Rich reported that some of the door hangers with FCC information have been distributed.

Adjournment: With no further business brought to the Board, the meeting adjourned on motion of Justin Quick and second by John Daniel at 11:37 am.

Closing Prayer: Rev. Sharla Hulsey closed the meeting with prayer.
