

Your New Year's Resolution

If a person needs to eat better and exercise more, then we can start that at any time, and it should come out of a desire to feel better, not guilt over the number of Christmas cookies we consumed.

Instead, I would like to invite us all to undertake a different kind of resolution this year. This year, let's make kindness our default setting. As we make your way through the world, let's look for opportunities to be kind. They don't have to be huge or cost us a whole lot in money or time: maybe you notice that your checker at Walmart is having a tough day, so you give them a word of encouragement and a smile. Or someone is struggling with trying to carry too much stuff at once, so you offer to take some of it for them.

Imagine what the world could be like if everyone defaulted to kindness whenever we have the chance. Realistically, we know we can't make everyone be kind, but if each of us take every possible opportunity to be kind ourselves, it just might turn out to be contagious.

Scripture: Mark 1:16-20; 2:13-17 (RCL: 1:16-20, Epiphany 3, Year B; 2:13-17, Epiphany 8, Year B)
Psalm: 62:5-8, 11-12
Theme: Jesus calls his first disciples
Title: "Follow Me"
What I was thinking: In Mark, the first four disciples Jesus calls to follow him are fishermen. The fifth is a tax collector, and his presence stirs up some controversy.

January 14 (2nd Sunday after Epiphany)

Scripture: Mark 4:26-34 (RCL: Proper 6, Year B) Psalm: 126 Theme: parables of the kingdom Title: "Lazy Gardening" *What I was thinking:* When Jesus tries to explain what the Reign of God he came to proclaim is like, he comes not with propositions and lectures, but with stories of everyday things—with a twist.

January 28 (4th Sunday after Epiphany)

Scripture: Mark 4:35-41 (RCL: Proper 7, Year B) Psalm: 89:1-2, 5-9 Theme: Jesus stills a storm on the Sea of Galilee Title: "Why are you sleeping when we're about to drown?!" *What I was thinking:* The scene is reminiscent of the storm in Jonah 1, but with a very different outcome.

Shawn Quick, Chair, called the meeting to order at 10:48 AM. He then opened with prayer.

After review and additions, the agenda was adopted on motion of Carol Roberts and second by Justin Quick.

The minutes of the Congregational Meeting of 11-5-23 were reviewed and approved on motion by Phyllis McBrayer and seconded by Kathy Wood. The minutes of the 11-19-2023 regular Board Meeting were reviewed and approved as presented on motion of Judy Daniel and second by John Daniel.

Financial Reports: The November 2023 Profit & Loss and Balance Sheet financial reports, as of 11-30-2023, were reviewed by Carol Lewis, Treasurer. She noted the November income of \$7,006.92 and expense of \$9,276.61. Year-to-date income of \$103,177.42 and Y-T-D expenses of \$116,383.79. Ministers' Report: Rev. Hulsey reviewed her December report that was included in the Board packet. She noted activities from November and December including meetings attended, several telephone calls, texts, hospital visits, in-person conversations. She noted that Morning Prayer continues via Facebook Live at 7:00. She reminded everyone of the Christmas Eve Service at 6:30. She expressed a big "Thank You" to all involved in the decorating the church for the Christmas season. She will be attending class in Tulsa in January. Shawn Quick will fill the pulpit January 14. Lenten Services are being planned by the Ministerial Alliance starting 02-21-24. Meals will be provided. More details to follow. OLD BUSINESS:

Everett McBrayer reports he is having trouble wiring it together each year. After much discussion a motion was made by Carol Roberts and seconded by Justin Quick to purchase a new tree for no more than \$1,000. This was approved. John Daniel stated he knows someone that might have access to get this at a lower price. Carol Roberts stated to be sure to check with the decorating group before purchasing.
