Our kids are back to school now, and they're going to be learning all sorts of new things. But we adults oftentimes stop learning anything new that doesn't have to do with our jobs. Why is that?

We might say we don't have time. It's true that modern life can be busy, and if you're a parent and have kids involved in assorted activities, it can be even more so. But I have found, personally, that I *make* time for things that I really want to do. It might mean changing my schedule around, or maybe dropping something I'm doing that no longer suits (although if you've signed on for, say, a three-year term on a board or some such, I would urge you to stick with it for the full term, *then* let it go). Or I might choose to figure out ways to learn something *while* doing something else. For instance, if you commute for work, find a podcast about something you're interested in and listen to it while you travel.



If every day is filled with hard work and stress, questions about things that don't relate to our work or our lives directly might just get shut down. But even things that don't seem to relate just might offer insight that could make our lives easier. I've heard stories of people who are working on a particular problem that has them stumped, and then a new collaborator who has experience in different areas looks at the problem in a fresh way and offers a solution the others would never have considered.

What are you curious about? Do you wonder what the birds are that you see or hear singing in the mornings? Go learn about birds. Do you have a desire to understand the chemistry behind the cooking or baking that you do, or are you interested in the foods of other countries and cultures? There is so much information out there about that!

Thanks to the internet, we have access to more knowledge than anyone who came before us could have dreamed of. YouTube is an amazing resource for history, cooking, and how-to videos about all kinds of tasks. Of course you have to approach the internet with a fair amount of critical thinking. Some things are obvious: don't waste your time, for instance, on videos arguing that aliens built the Great Pyramids or Stonehenge or whatever. If you read or hear something that doesn't sound right to you, go out there and see what other information you can find, whether others agree with what the first source says or not.

There is, of course, the "old-fashioned way" of learning: read books, go to the library, take a class. But whatever way you choose, I hope you will follow the example of our kids heading back to school, and go learn something new. Remember that God gave us our minds and our curiosity, and expects us to use them.

Scripture: Genesis 3:1-13 (RCL: Lent 1, Year A) Responsive Reading: Psalm 31:1-5 Theme: Creation and Fall Title: "The Buck Stops Here" *What I was thinking:* There are two creation narratives in Genesis. The second focuses on the first man and the first woman, living innocently in Eden. Then something goes terribly wrong.

September 22, 2024 (3rd Sunday after Epiphany)

Scripture: Genesis 15:1-18 (RCL: Lent 2, Year C) Responsive Reading: Psalm 27:1-3, 13-14 Theme: God's promise to Abraham Title: "I meant what I said." *What I was thinking:* God made a promise to Abraham and Sarah back in Genesis 12. Here in chapter 15, the promise is reiterated in dramatic fashion.

September 29, 2024 (4th Sunday after Epiphany)

Scripture: Exodus 12:1-13; 13:3-8 (RCL: Maundy Thursday, all years; Proper 18, Year A) Responsive Reading: Psalm 116:5-9, 11-14 Theme: the Passover celebration Title: "Why is this night different from other nights?" *What I was thinking:* Knowing that our Communion observance originated in the Passover meal, what can its meaning tell us about what we're celebrating at the Table?

FIRST CHRISTIAN CHURCH Board Meeting Minutes August 18, 2024

Board Members present: Deacons: Carol Hedrick, Lyssa Lile, Judy Daniel, Derek Lile, Jennifer Schmehl, Kathy Wood, Peggy Thomas, Steve Hedrick, Bob Thomas. Elders: John Daniel, Carol Roberts, Diana Rich, Shawn Quick, Chuck Lewis. Others present: Carol Lewis, Reverend Sharla Hulsey, Carol Ann Winburn, Everett McBrayer, Phyllis McBrayer.

Shawn Quick, chairperson, called the meeting to order at 10:40 am and opened with prayer. The agenda for the meeting was amended to include boundary lines under old business, nominating and budget committee under new business, and Memorial Gifts, Membership and Property under Committees/Departments reports. This amended agenda was approved unanimously after a motion by Judy Daniel and a second by Kathy Wood.

After reviewing the July 21, 2024, board meeting minutes there were no changes or additions. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Diana Rich and seconded by John Daniel. Approved unanimously.

Financial Reports—Carol Lewis reviewed the financial reports for June and July 2024. For June, the Profit and Loss report showed income of \$11,428.60 and expenses at \$11,752.08. Net income was -\$323.48. July's Profit and Loss report shows income at \$8,389.91 and expenses at \$10,138.85 with a net income of -\$1,748.94. All financial reports are available at the church office for review. With a motion to approve June's financial report by Chuck Lewis and seconded by Bob Thomas, June's reports were approved unanimously. With a motion by Chuck Lewis to approve July's financial reports, seconded by Bob Thomas, July's financial reports were also approved unanimously.

Minister's Report—

Reverend Hulsey then reviewed her report. In addition to conversations via email, texts, and in-person, she states she attempted to visit a member of the church at a hospital but was told that person was not there. She served as Chi Rho counselor at Faith Adventures Camp in July and attended the Elders meeting and the Memorial Gift committee meetings the first part of August. She continues with daily morning prayer on Facebook. Plans to be gone the weekend September 8 but states plans for that service are being made.

Old Business—

Boundary Lines—Shawn distributed maps showing the property line in question on the south side of the church. The line is at the south end of the storage building that is on that lot. The adjacent business does have their dumpster on church property, but that lot is only used for parking on Sundays. Carol Roberts pointed out that this is "no big deal" and no action is needed.

New Business—

Conexon Connect—Lyssa Lile states that she notified them of our interest in their internet. They also have phone and fax available, and it would be \$150.00 per month for all 3 services. Sharla questioned whether that included long distance. Lyssa will check into that.

Nominating committee—Carol Roberts is chair and needs 4 board members and 4 members from the congregation for that committee. John Daniel volunteered to be on that committee.

New Business cont.

Budget committee—Shawn reminded department chairs that they will need to turn in their 2025 budget by the Sept. board meeting. Lyssa stated that she can give any department chair a breakdown of their 2024 department expenditures to help with this process.

Committee and Department Reports-

Memorial Gift committee—Judy Daniel states that they met Aug. 14 and identified several ideas for the use of some of the money. She will have more to report in September.

Membership committee—Carol Roberts stated that the membership committee is having a potluck lunch after church on Sept 22. More information later.

Property committee—Chuck Lewis states that he contacted plumber Jim Daniel about the septic tank. He said he could recommend a company to have the septic tank cleaned out for \$400.00. He also recommended that we do so on a regular basis. Jim Daniel stated he would look at our septic tank and get back with Chuck but has not done so yet. After discussion, Chuck is to try to get other bids to get this done.

There being no further business brought before the board, a motion was made by Diana Rich to adjourn. Seconded by Carol Hedrick. Unanimously approved, the meeting adjourned at 11:15.
