What I'm Thankful For

It seems appropriate to me that the same month contains both Veterans' Day and Thanksgiving. Over the years I have had occasion to talk with several veterans of the Second World War. In one of these conversations I let the veteran know that I appreciated his service. He told me that in the decades since his service, I was only the second person who had told him that.

This just doesn't seem right to me. I think that, since the days of the war in Vietnam, some of us have a different view of war than those who lived through World War II did, whether they were children, or fought in the war, or supported the war effort through their work or volunteer duties here at home. Nevertheless, while we may not always agree with the decisions made by the leadership of our country or of our armed forces, and we have the right and the responsibility to speak out in such cases, the men and women who serve, and who go to battle and risk their lives for their country and for our sake, deserve our respect.

This month as I begin to reflect on the many blessings God has given me, one of the things that comes to my mind is the blessing of living in this country, with freedoms that few other people on this earth today or at any time in history could imagine having. The blessings I have as a result of being a citizen of the United States of America are not without cost, though; and I am thankful for all those who have set aside their own comfort, and in many cases even their lives, to pay that cost. I cannot repay what they have given me; but I can express my appreciation. I can—and I believe we all should, however we're able—to find ways to make life easier for our veterans, especially those who return home with physical, mental, or spiritual injuries.

To all veterans who are reading this, whether you served in World War II, Korea, Vietnam, Iraq, Kosovo, Afghanistan, or any other place around the globe: Thank you. I appreciate your service. May God watch over you and bless you.



November 2, 2025 (Proper 26)

Scripture: 1 Kings 19:1-18 (RCL: Proper 7, Year C)

Psalm: 13

Theme: The aftermath of Elijah's triumph *Title*: "You must walk your lonesome valley..."

What I was thinking: After receiving a death threat from the queen, Elijah crashes and burns; and then God

rescues him.

November 9, 2025 (Proper 27)

Scripture: Amos 5:14-15, 21-24

Psalm: 17:1-8

Theme: God's wrath

Title: "It's not what you think."

What I was thinking: Without God's wrath, God's justice is toothless. But upon whom does God's wrath fall?

November 16, 2025 (Proper 28)

Scripture: Exodus 34:1-10 O Antiphon: "O Adonai"

Psalm: 20:1-8

Theme: the Name of God Title: "Not Jehovah"

What I was thinking: I am starting our Advent theme a bit early. We will be focusing on the seven "O Antiphons" which Christians have prayed during Advent since the Middle Ages. We begin with "O Adonai" today, and will end with "O Emmanuel" on Christmas Eve. Today we will think about God's Name as revealed to Moses, along with other ways God has been addressed by faithful people throughout history.

November 23, 2025 (Proper 29/Christ the King)

Scripture: Philippians 2:5-11 (RCL: Proper 21, Year A; and Palm Sunday, all years)

O Antiphon: "O King of all the nations"

Psalm: 24:7-10

Theme: the nature of Christ's kingship

Title: "Standing on Our Heads"

What I was thinking: "Christ the King" Sunday was instituted in the early 20th century in response to rising nationalism throughout the western world. We are reminded that we have but one King, Jesus Christ. But his is a reign unlike that of any other monarch who has ever existed on earth.

November 30 (First Sunday of Advent)

Scripture: Colossians 1:15-20 (RCL: Christ the King, Year C)

O Antiphon: "O Wisdom"

Psalm: 46
Theme: Hope

Title: "You're old, but you're wise."

What I was thinking: Today we begin Advent with an exploration of God's wisdom and how that wisdom, made known to us in Jesus Christ, gives us hope for a future much different from the inescapable troubles of this world.

The meeting was called to order at 10:39 by Carol Roberts, chairperson. Opening prayer was given by Justin Quick. The agenda was reviewed and requests to add Outreach, Membership, and Property committee reports were made. The agenda was approved unanimously after a motion was made by Phyllis McBrayer and seconded by Shawn Quick.

The minutes of the September meeting were reviewed. Motion to accept the minutes was made by Chuck Lewis, seconded by Justin Quick. Motion passed unanimously.

Financial Reports—the financial reports included in the packet were reviewed by Carol Lewis, board treasurer. Budget vs. Actuals, Sept. 2025. Total income \$6,948.03 (budget \$10,291.67)

Full Financial reports for review are available in the church office. Motion to accept the financial reports was made by Justin Quick, seconded by Bob Thomas and approved unanimously.

Minister's Report—Rev. Hulsey stated that she had conversations with various members as per usual. She delivered the Festival of Sharing boxes in KC, attended the funeral for Evelyn Dunlap, attended a webinar on church revitalization, and attended meetings for the Nominating Committee, Ministerial Alliance, Faith Adventures steering committee (one in person, one Zoom meeting), and Disciples Women. She also reported that the Son Shine Ladies group will be ending their meetings. We will be having a community Thanksgiving service on Sunday, November 23, 2025, at the Butler Community of Christ Church at 5:00pm. There will be an offering for the Butler Ministerial Alliance, and a combined choir will sing. Anyone who is interested in joining the choir for this service please let Rev. Hulsey or Carol Ann Winburn know.

Old Business-there was no old business.

New Business—

<u>2026 Budget Proposal</u>—Diana Rich, Stewardship Department Chairperson, presented the recommended budget for 2026. During discussion, Phyllis McBrayer recommended an increase to the salary of the Administrative Assistant. After discussion, a motion was made by Phyllis McBrayer to increase this budget line item. This motion was seconded by Don Cole and passed unanimously. Then a motion to approve the entire budget for 2026 as revised was made by Don Cole, seconded by Kathy Wood, and passed unanimously.


