#### A "Little Lent"

I've heard it said that Advent was, earlier in Christian history, meant to be a "little Lent," a time of penitence and preparation for the celebration of Jesus' birth, just as Lent in the spring is a time of penitence and preparation for the celebration of Jesus' resurrection. These days, for us Protestants who observe Advent, we may try to prepare our hearts for Jesus' coming (and Advent is traditionally the time when we remember that Jesus will one day return in glory), but the penitence portion of the historical observance is very much diminished.

Advent as a time of penitence might not really be welcome, and I'm frankly not entirely sure it's necessary. However, another aspect of Lent that we might wish to consider in Advent—as a new year's resolution of sorts, since Advent is the beginning of the church year—is the taking up of new spiritual practices, or deepening our practice of those disciplines we are already working on. We may wish to add a prayer time to our daily routine, for instance.

Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, I've been leading Morning Prayer on Facebook Live. I know that many of you have been joining me on a daily or occasional basis, and I hope it helps you begin your day on a positive note. As we begin Advent on November 30, I am going to make a small change to my Morning Prayer practice.

As you probably know, I take my day off on Saturday. Therefore, beginning December 6 (the feast day of St. Nicholas of Myra, incidentally), I am not going to livestream Morning Prayers on Saturdays. When the Morning Prayer orders are posted for the week, the Saturday installment will include not only a hymn and Scripture reading, but also the meditation for the day from whatever resource we're using. (Right now we're working through *A Cherokee Feast of Days* by Joyce Sequichie Hifler, but in January we will begin a new book of daily readings.)

I hope that you will continue to pray daily, perhaps taking up the practice of praying before meals if that's not already part of your routine, or even ending your day with prayer if you don't already. (A number of churches have created videos you can watch on YouTube that guide you through a traditional Compline, or Evening Prayer, service, if you would find that helpful.) And I hope that, during this busy season, you'll also join me in taking seriously the importance of rest and renewal of our bodies, minds, and spirits.



#### December 7, 2025 (2nd Sunday of Advent)

Scripture: John 10:1-18 (RCL: vv. 1-10, Easter 4, Year A; vv. 11-18, Easter 4, Year B)

O Antiphon: O Key of David

Psalm 23

Advent Theme: Love

Title: "Do me a favor: open the door and let 'em in."

What I was thinking: (h/t to Sir Paul, of course) The image of Jesus as Good Shepherd has been the subject of countless works of art through the centuries. But there are more images there. What are they, and how do they inform today's Advent theme of love?

### December 14, 2025 (3rd Sunday of Advent)

Scripture: Isaiah 9:2-7 (RCL: Christmas 1st Proper, all years)

O Antiphon: O Radiant Dawn

Psalm 96

Advent Theme: Joy

Title: "Sunshine in the Valley"

What I was thinking: What happens when a person can't muster up "merry" at Christmas time, because of grief, worry, or trouble? Is there good news for those who are walking in darkness?

#### December 21, 2025 (4th Sunday of Advent)

Scripture: Isaiah 11:1-10 (RCL: Advent 2, Year A)

O Antiphon: O Root of Jesse

Psalm 27:1, 4-5, 13-14 Advent Theme: Peace

Title: "It came a flow'ret bright..."

What I was thinking: The idea that "a shoot will come out of the stump of Jesse" is paired with images of a peaceable kingdom in which the strong no longer attack the weak. Behind this is the Hebrew notion of shalom, a peace that is much more than quiet or the absence of conflict.

#### December 28, 2025 (1st Sunday of Christmas)

Scripture: John 1:1-18 (RCL: Christmas 2, and Christmas 3<sup>rd</sup> Proper, all years)

Psalm 130:5-8

Theme: The Incarnation

Title: "The Tabernacle in the Wilderness"

What I was thinking: Matthew tells us that Jesus is to have another name, Immanuel. In Hebrew the word "is" is left out, so whether it means God-with-us or God is with us is a matter of interpretation. What does it mean that Jesus is the incarnation of God living among us?

The meeting was called to order at 10:48 by Carol Roberts, chairperson. Opening prayer was given by Shawn Quick. The agenda was reviewed and requests to add Outreach, Membership, and Property committee reports were made. The agenda was approved unanimously after a motion was made by Justin Quick and seconded by Carol Hedrick.

The minutes of the October Board meeting and the Oct. 19 Congressional meeting were reviewed. Carol Roberts stated that the Congressional meeting minutes needed an addendum showing results of the vote to accept the nominees and budget, which were 30 Yes, 0 No. Motion to accept the minutes of the Board meeting was made by Chuck Lewis, seconded by Shawn Quick. Motion passed unanimously. Motion to accept the minutes of the Congressional meeting with the addendum was made by Shawn Quick, seconded by Phyllis McBrayer and passed unanimously.

Full financial reports are available for review in the church office. Motion to accept the reports was made by Phyllis McBrayer, seconded by Carol Hedrick and passed unanimously.

MINISTER'S REPORTS—Rev. Hulsey reported several phone and in person conversations with members in various locations. She helped prepare food for and serve Community Cafe on Oct. 21. She also prepared 24 meals-in-bags to be distributed by the Carpenter's Cup to those in need of food. She and Julie Nelson prepared the service for the Ministerial Alliance's Thanksgiving Service on Nov. 23. She also attended the Disciple's Women meeting on Nov.4, the Ministerial Alliance meeting on Nov.6 and the Elders meeting on Nov. 9. She also stated that in addition to meals-in-bags, the Carpenter's Cup need clean, empty containers such as cottage cheese containers for their food distribution. You can bring those to the church or drop them off at the Carpenter's Cup.

#### OLD BUSINESS-

The outside light above the north door has not been fixed (awaiting electrician). Don Cole states that the cost for this has been taken care of.

#### **NEW BUSINESS-**

#### COMMITTEE AND DEPARTMENT REPORTS-

<u>Endowment Trustees—Christian Church Foundation:</u> Carol Ann Winburn reviewed the Foundation reports included in the board packet. She stated that we recently moved some funds to a slightly more aggressive fund.

Membership committee-Carol Hedrick reported that the membership committee is planning a soup and sandwich lunch after church on Dec. 7.

<u>Property committee</u>-Phyllis McBrayer reported that the furnace needs to have a fan replaced but will be covered under the budget.

Outreach committee-Phyllis McBrayer reported that the Community Cafe board met and for 4 of the First Christian Church's meals the food will be provided by some other organization or individual in 2026. She states on Nov. 18, we will be fixing a turkey dinner for the Community Cafe and she could use some extra help for that.

The Moulton Fund will be distributed in December and if anyone knows of anyone in our church or not in our church in need of money for utilities, food or any other reason, to let Phyllis or Rev. Hulsey know. The money must be distributed by a certain date (around Christmas).

ADJOURNMENT-there being no further business, Shawn Quick made the motion to adjourn, seconded by Carol Hedrick and passed unanimously. Closing prayer given by Rev. Hulsey. Meeting adjourned at 11:26.
